
Seesaw Shutter Card Idea shared with the Crafting Acorns by Tricia Clark

Start with a piece of cardstock measuring 10.5 x 18.5 cm

Blue dashed lines are score lines and Red lines are cut lines



Score and Cut in the following order

- 1. Score the two vertical outer lines at 2.0 cm from each end.
- 2. Cut the two horizontal lines 2.0 cm down and 2.0 cm in. Each cut will be 14.5 cm long.
- 3. Score the remaining vertical lines. Note the line on the left does not go through the middle section and the line on the right is only in the middle section.

Cut double-sided paper as follows. Glue to the relevant panels as you go. You can mix and match or use the same design for all the panels.

- 1. Two outer vertical panels 1.5 x 10.0 cm each
- 2. Top and bottom horizontal panels 1.5 x 12.0 cm each
- 3. Large middle panel 6.0 x 12.0 cm
- 4. Small vertical panel (end of larger middle panel) 1.5 x 6.0 cm
- 5. Two small squares 1.5 x 1.5 cm each

There should be eight pieces in total.

Fold and burnish the score lines as follows

- 1. Two outer vertical lines (the ones that go from top to bottom) Mountain Fold
- 2. All other vertical lines Valley Fold

Decorate the front of the card – sentiment and or images as desired.

Cut a 6.0 x 12.0 cm piece of Basic White or Very Vanilla cardstock for the panel on the reverse. Decorate this piece as desired before adhering it to the back panel.
